

#### **Preamble:**

The core message focused on the idea that many individuals often limit

The speaker expressed gratitude for the opportunity to address the audience and acknowledged the honor of sharing the stage with distinguished dignitaries. He also

acknowledged the efforts of the Alumni group and the ongoing connection with the college, emphasizing the personal importance of this association. #### Special Address by Prof. (Dr.) Damodar Acharya:

Prof. (Dr.) Damodar Acharya, former Director of IIT, Kharagpur and former Chairman, AICTE was the Special Guest of Honor. As a distinguished academic leader, he shared insights into India's education system and its evolution. He highlighted three institutions in India that emerged from repurposed infrastructure:

- 1. University of Roorkee Developed from leftover materials from the Gangadhar project.
- 2. Burla Engineering College, Odisha Built using materials left over from the Hirakud Dam construction.
- 3. CEMK Established with resources from the Kolaghat Thermal Power Project.



Dr. Acharya emphasized the importance of skill development beyond traditional education. He pointed out that while India produces 1.5 million engineers annually, only a small percentage are truly employable. He encouraged students to:

- Aim for better job opportunities in India and abroad.
- Improve communication skills, especially in English, for better global prospects.
- Engage in active problem-solving from the early years of engineering education.

He concluded by stressing the significance of listening to English news channels like BBC and Voice of America, summarizing daily learnings, and practicing structured communication.

## Speech by Mr. Anurag Kirti:

Mr. Anurag Kirti, HR-India at Lexmark International and former HR at Wipro Technologies, delivered an enlightening talk on the evolving job market, offering valuable insights to students. He emphasized the importance of focusing on building practical skills rather than



solely concentrating on academic grades. According to Mr. Kirti, real-world competencies are what employers look for, and students should ensure their resumes reflect these skills, demonstrating their ability to contribute effectively in the workplace.

He encouraged students to be open to change and continuously adapt to new challenges, as these qualities are essential for success across all industries. 
